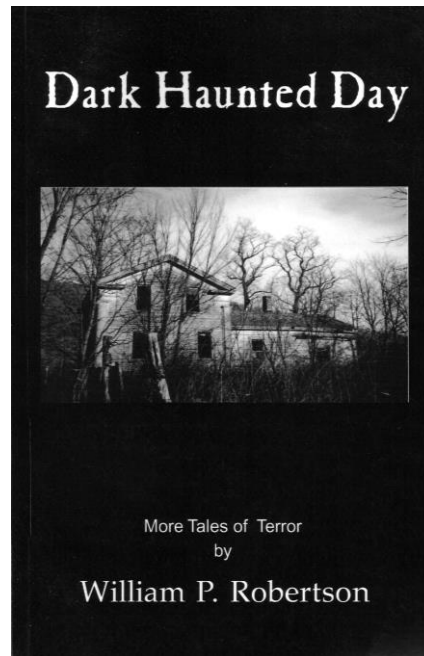


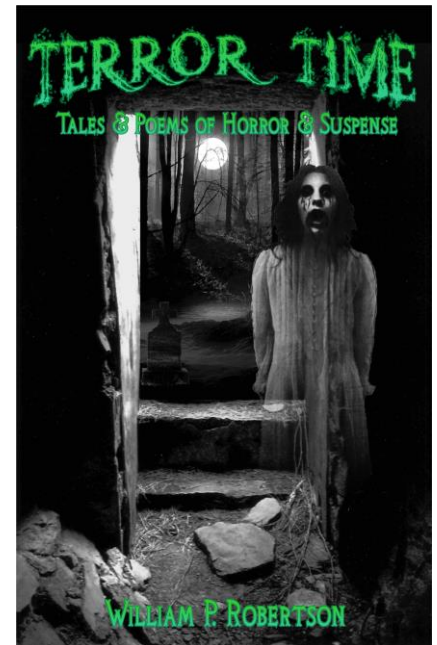
INFINITY PUBLISHING PRESENTS THE MACABRE TALES OF WILLIAM P. ROBERTSON



Lurking in Pennsylvania collects three decades of William P. Robertson's best horror stories and poems, many of which appeared in magazines worldwide. Bill specializes in understated Gothic terror in the tradition of H.P. Lovecraft and Edgar Allan Poe. He draws his material from local legends, his grandma's Swedish folktales, and traumatic personal experiences. He also dabbles in dark humor and lends a fresh perspective to the werewolf and troll. The author's best work chills rather than sickens. Sometimes what is left unsaid is most terrifying of all, especially amid Bill's eerie photos.



As the title would indicate, ghost stories are the focus of **Dark Haunted Day**. A gallant battlefield ghost, a malicious dorm phantom, and two spectral husbands are just a few of the hobgoblins haunting this anthology. The author again selects for his action such Pennsylvania settings as Gettysburg, Mansfield, and the ever-spooky McKean County. To add variety, a hunting horror story, a psychological thriller, and a Kinzua Viaduct death tale are included to prey on one's imagination. Characters range from children to the elderly, and all get their share of scares.



Terror Time is the author's hardest hitting collection of macabre tales. The book kicks off with a second visit from femme fatale, Lauren Watson, as she wreaks havoc on another branch of her family. Bill's first dark fantasy story appears here, too, as he relates the trials of an aging Viking smitten with a witch. A ghostly encounter with the specter haunting McKean County's Old Jail and two winter travel tales squeeze the chills from more modern settings. Two Western-style yarns of adventure and intrigue round out the action. These feature Robertson's Bucktail heroes, Bucky Culp, Jimmy Jewett, and Boone Crossmire.
